
Website Editor

Our website is integrated with a headless CMS called Sanity.io. In other words, we have a user friendly editor for our website.





Website Redesign


After getting feedback from our mentor, Stephanie Moon, and UCLA PMHP's webmaster, Joe Mango, we redesigned our website.
